This course will introduce you to basic grammar, vocabulary, and concepts of the Japanese language and culture relevant to a variety of interpersonal, public, and cultural contexts. This course will also enhance your Japanese communication skills by providing systematic opportunities to practice both oral and written communication. Emphasis will be on basic integrated skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Your classroom experiences will include lectures, pair work, small group activities, etc.

講義方法 **METHODS OF INSTRUCTION**

This class will require out-of-class study every day. We will generally approach each lesson as follows:

1. Quiz
2. Review of previous lessons (Be ready to ask and answer questions.)
3. Lecture on new material
4. Exercise in small groups
5. Summary and review of the day

Vocabulary and writing (*katakana*, *hiragana* and *kanji*) should be practiced daily outside of class. It is important to pay attention and ASK QUESTIONS in class when you do not understand for your sake and for the sake of others.

宿題 Homework:

Homework will be assigned almost daily, and will usually require use of worksheets given out in class. Unless instructed otherwise, homework is due at the beginning of class. Homework will be graded in terms of punctuality, completion, and quality. Refer to Grading Policy for Worksheets for details.

You are expected to do your homework by yourself (and not with a classmate or with anyone else who may be able to help you with the work). If you copy someone else's work or get unauthorized assistance from a translation device or from a classmate or a native/ more advanced speaker, it will be considered a violation of the University's academic honesty policy, and therefore it will be reported to the University.

クイズ Quizzes:

We will have frequent in-class quizzes over topics such as vocabulary, kanji, and grammar. Quizzes are generally given at the beginning of class. You will not be given extra time to work on quizzes if you are late, so punctual attendance is important. Your one lowest quiz grade will be dropped before your final grade is calculated.

There will be an oral test at the end of the semester. More details will be given at a later date.

期末試験 Final Exam:

We will have a cumulative final exam, covering lessons 1 through 7. The final exam is mandatory for all students.
